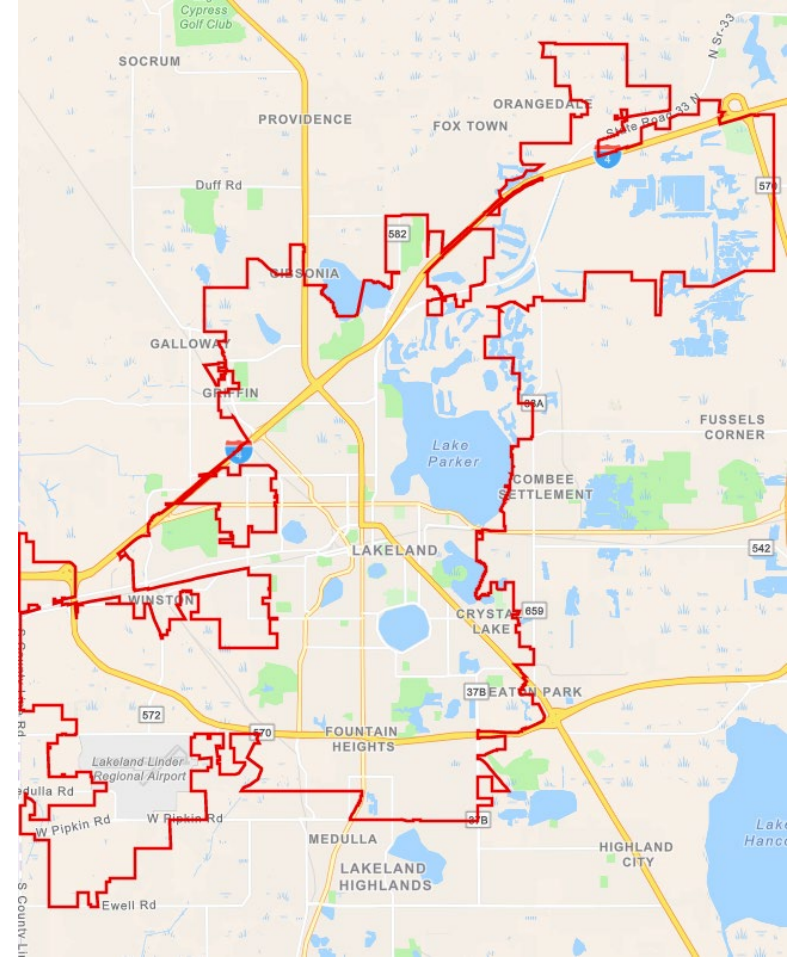

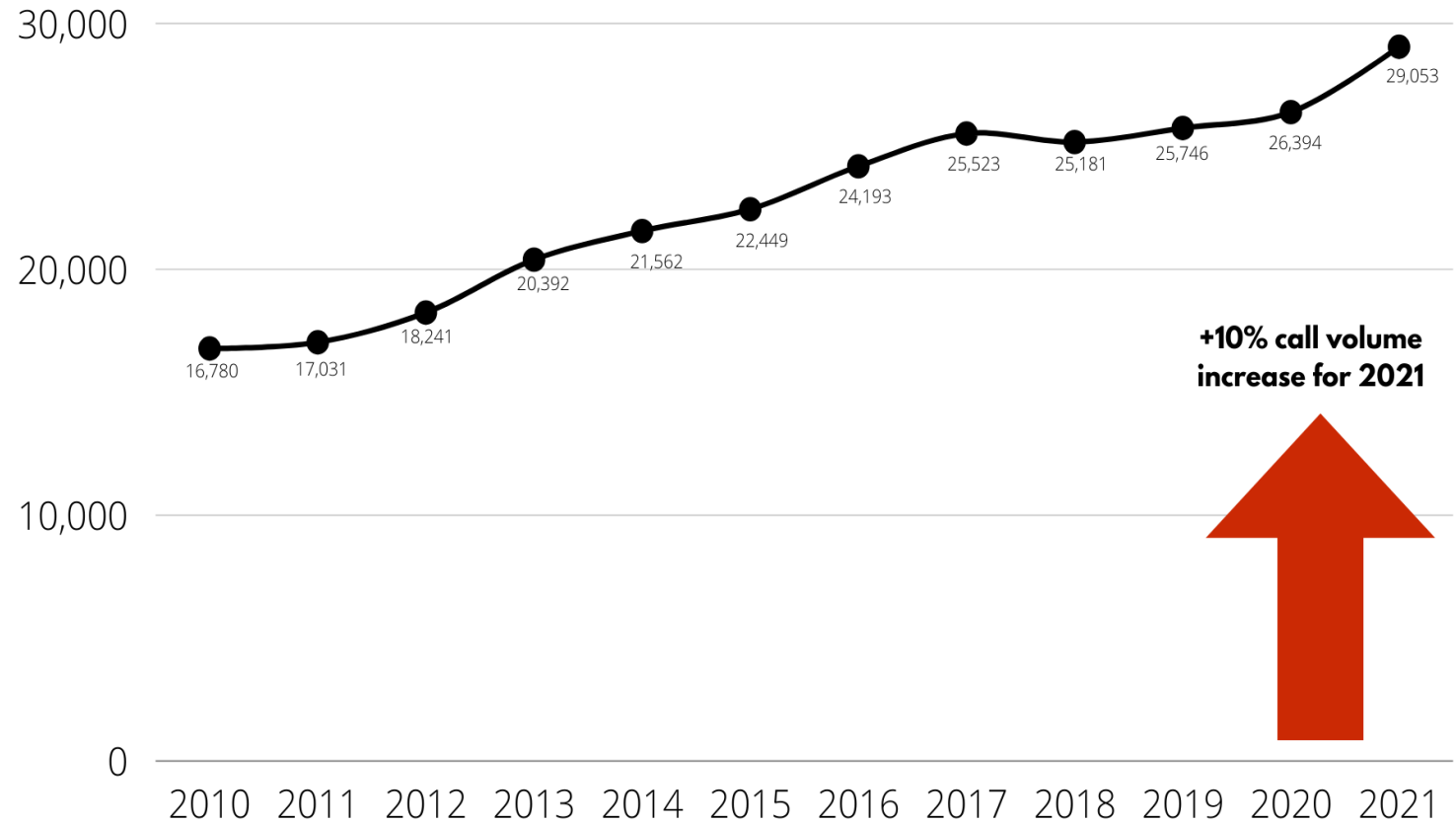

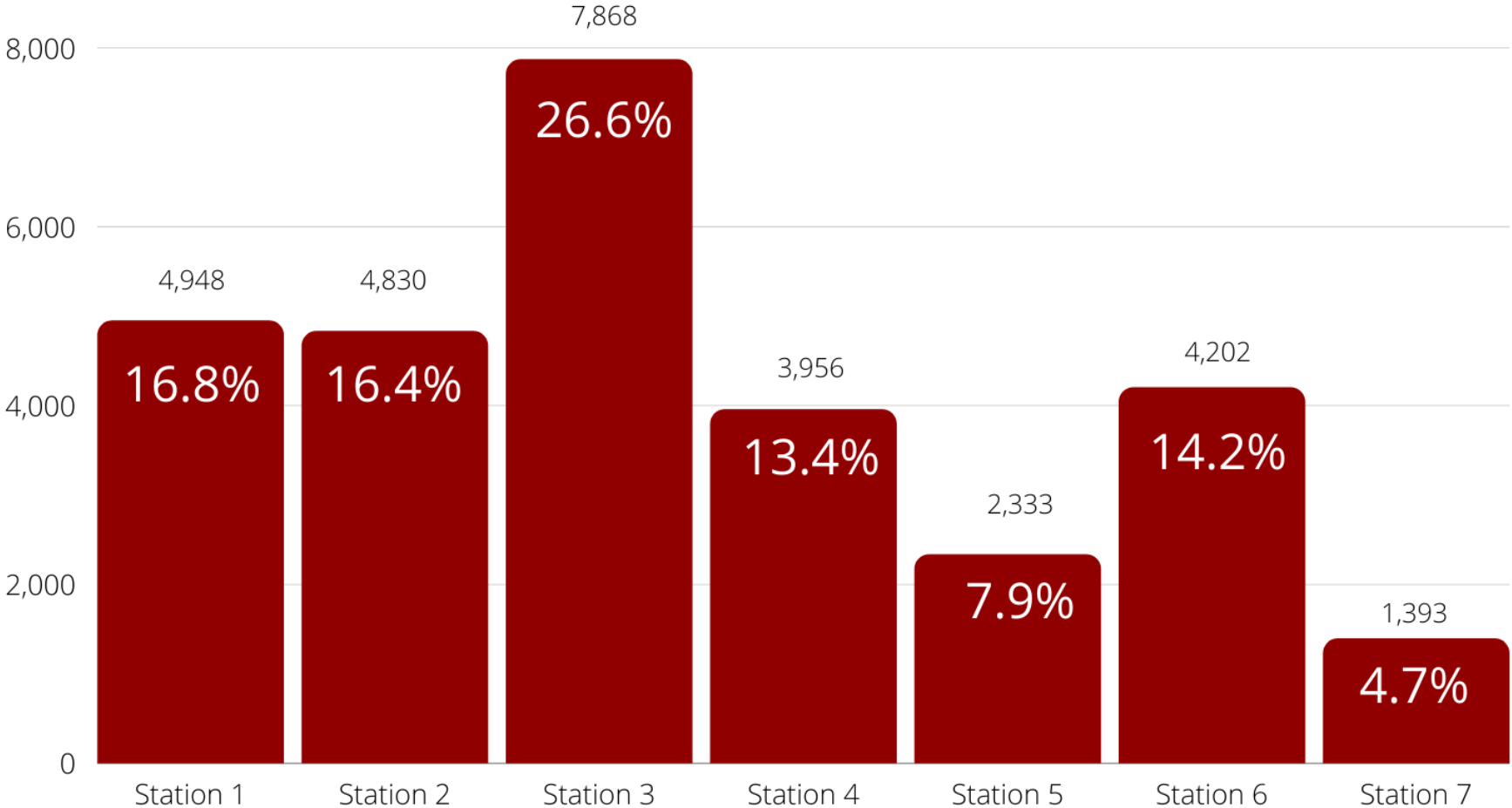

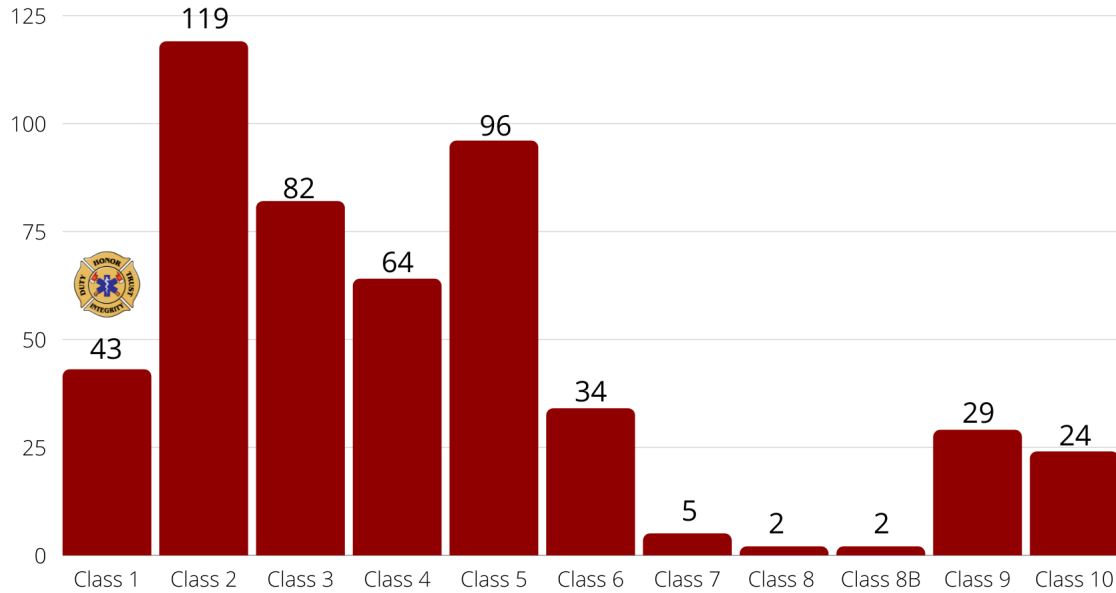

ANNUAL CALLS PER STATION

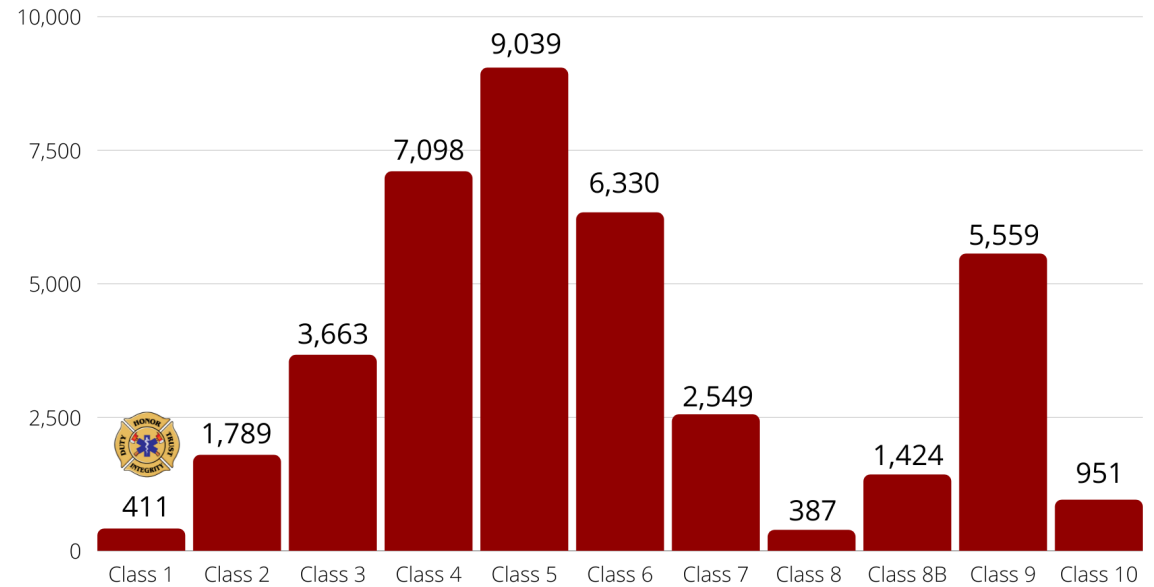

LAKELAND - TOP 8 %



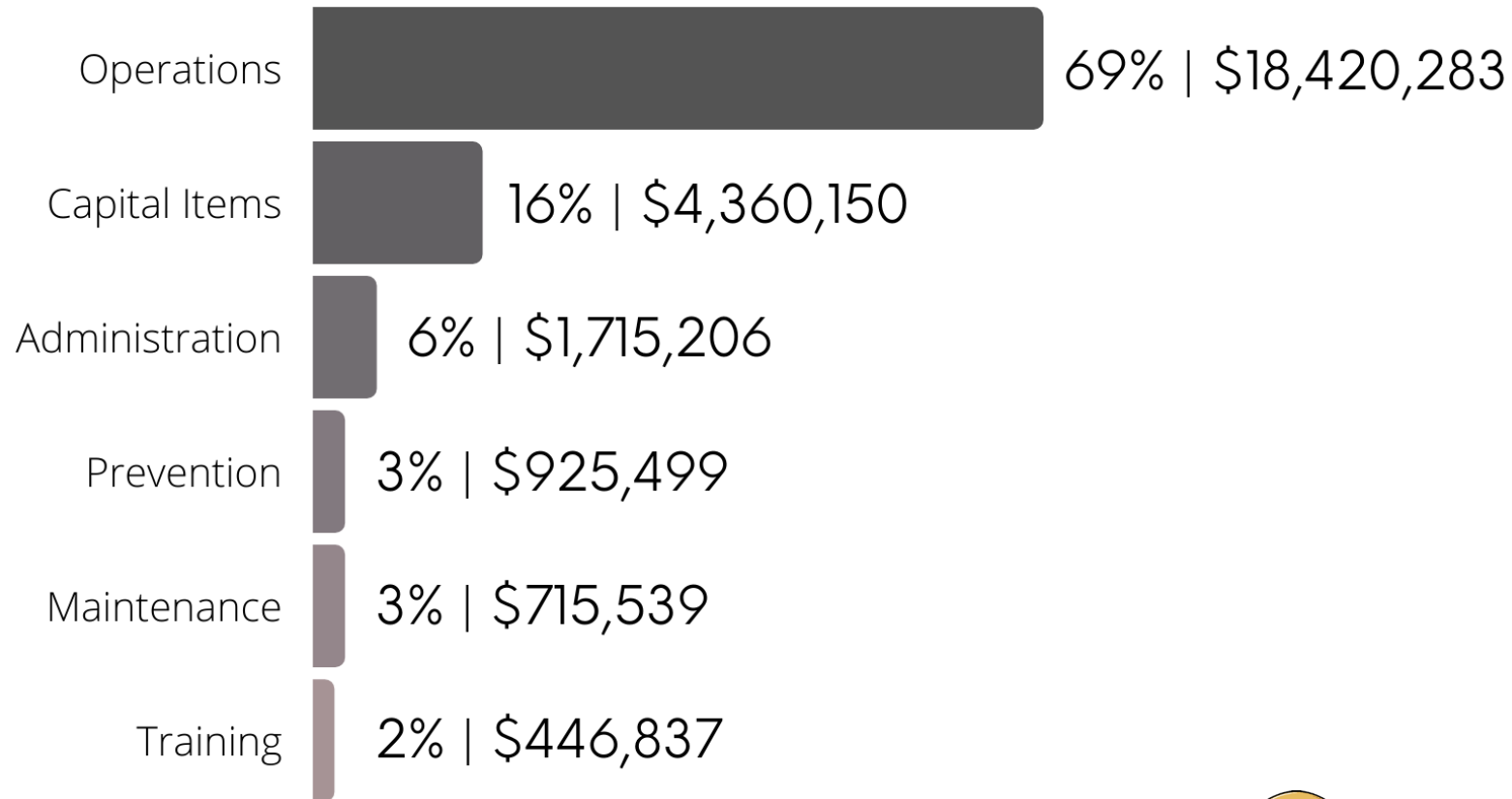
UNITED STATES
