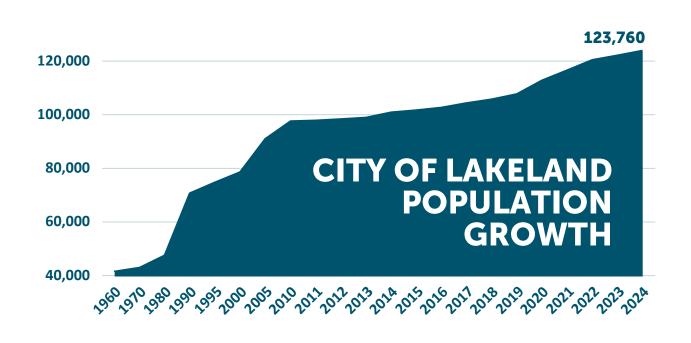

Between 2020 and 2024, population density rose by **9.7%** 

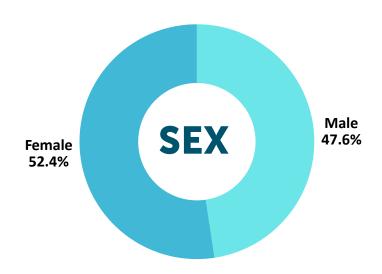

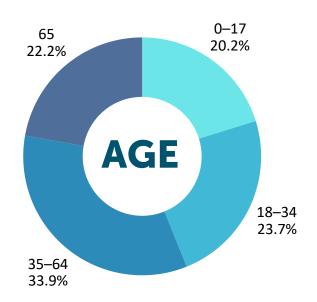

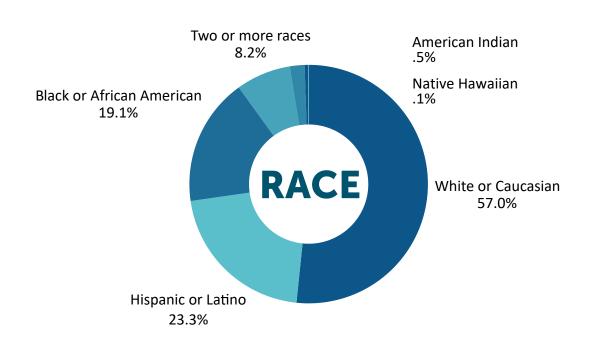

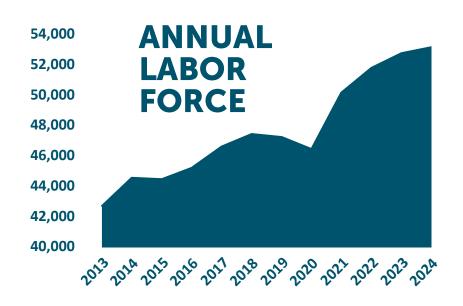

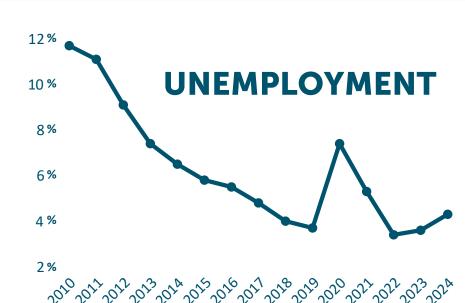

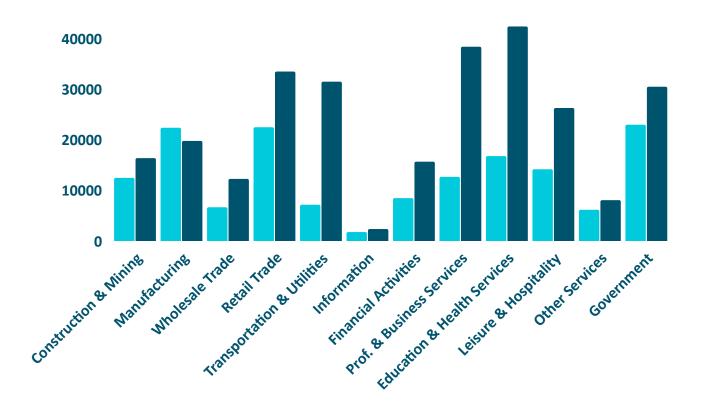

### **Industry Sector Comparison 1990 vs. 2025**



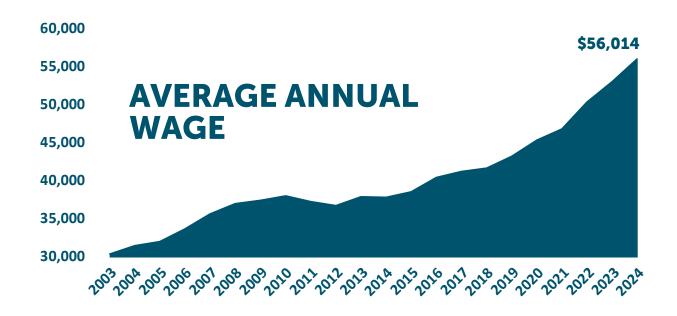

### TAX INFORMATION

#### **General Tax Climate**

- No state personal income tax, inventory tax, inheritance tax, or state ad valorem tax on real/tangible property.
- Florida's overall tax burden is lower than most southeastern states.
- Lakeland has one of the state's lowest city millage rates at 5.4323.

#### **Sales Tax**

- Florida state sales tax: 6%
- Local Polk County sales tax: +1%
- Exemptions: Food, medicine, machinery for new businesses, and R&D equipment.

#### **Corporate Income Tax**

- Based on modified federal income using a 3-factor formula (25% property, 25% payroll, 50% sales).
- \$5,000 exemption available.
- Corporate tax rate: 5.5%

#### **Communications Services Tax**

- Applies to telecom, cable, satellite, and related data/audio/video services.
- · Providers must register and remit taxes.

### Homestead Exemption Reforms (2008)

- 1. Additional \$25,000 exemption (excludes school taxes).
- 2. Portability: Transfer up to \$500,000 of "Save Our Homes" benefit to a new homestead.
- 3. Non-Homestead Cap: 10% annual limit on assessed value increases.
- 4. Business Equipment Exemption: \$25,000 off tangible property like office equipment.

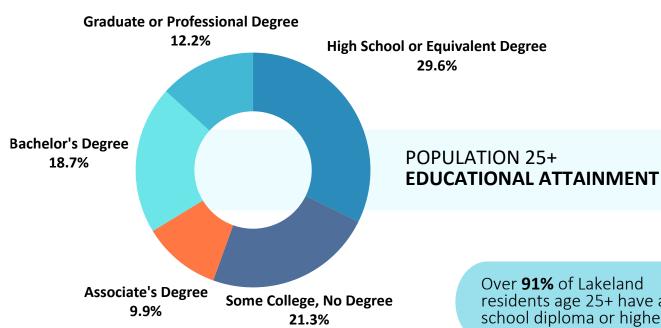

Lakeland's operating millage rate (**5.4323**) is among the lowest in the region, comparing favorably to nearby cities like Fort Meade (**8.5**) and Dundee (**7.9**)

### **EDUCATION**

Polk County serves nearly 100,000 students, offering a wide range of public and private education options. Within Lakeland, there are 33 elementary, 12 middle, and 8 high schools, plus multiple private schools representing various faiths for PreK-12.

The district also features 6 K-8 magnet/choice schools and 30+ specialized academies in middle and high schools focused on college and career readiness. These academies offer training in fields such as STEM, engineering, IT, finance, veterinary science, aerospace, culinary arts, and more.

### ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT INCENTIVES

#### **New Industry Expansion**

- Polk County Ad Valorem Tax
   Exemption: Encourages new and expanding high-value industries like manufacturing and QTI companies.
   Minimum wage:
  - 115% of avg. wage (\$47,204) or
  - 100% for manufacturers (\$41,047)
  - Final approval by the County Commission.
- Polk County Bonus Incentive (PCBI): Local cash incentive of \$500+ per new job for QTI-aligned businesses paying at least 115% of the average wage.
- Lakeland Electric Economic Rider:
   Utility rate reductions over 5 years for businesses with 350kW+ new load and 25+ new full-time jobs.

#### **Construction & Development**

- Lakeland Economic Development Impact Fee Mitigation (EDIFM): City fee reductions for:
  - a. High-wage job creation
  - b. Industrial job creation
  - c. Building industrial inventory
- Polk County Impact Fee Mitigation: County fee waivers/reductions for:

a. QTI businesses (115% avg. wage)

- b. QTI businesses (100% wage + \$10M investment)
- c. Developers building for QTI companies

#### **Location Specific**

#### **Urban Job Tax Credit (UJTC)**

 Businesses in designated Lakeland areas can earn \$500 per new full-time job, credited against state corporate income or sales tax. Eligible industries only.

#### **Core Improvement Area Incentive**

 Within 2.3 acres of Downtown Lakeland, non-residential and residential projects with a \$10M+ investment qualify for impact fee waivers, excluding water, wastewater, and fire service.

#### Foreign Trade Zone (FTZ 79)

 Companies can defer, reduce, or eliminate U.S. Customs duties on imported goods. Lakeland businesses may apply for FTZ 79 designation through the City of Tampa.

### LAKELAND CRA



#### **Lakeland Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA)**

The Lakeland CRA is a key driver of revitalization in the city's core neighborhoods. Working closely with the City of Lakeland, the CRA focuses on eliminating blight, improving infrastructure, and encouraging public and private investment to strengthen the city's urban areas.

#### **CRA Districts**

Lakeland has 3 CRA districts, each established to address specific redevelopment needs:

- Downtown Established in 1977
- Dixieland Established in 2001
- Midtown Established in 2001

Each district is a dependent taxing district. Meaning a portion of the property taxes generated within its boundaries is reinvested directly into the area.

#### Governance

- Each CRA district has an Advisory Board appointed by the City Commission.
- These boards recommend budgets, policies, and projects, while the City Commission has final approval authority.

#### **Types of CRA Projects**

All CRA-funded efforts must serve a public purpose and align with each district's redevelopment plan. Common projects include:

- Street and streetscape upgrades
- Park and public space improvements
- Infill housing development
- Business recruitment and support
- Job training and placement partnerships

#### **How CRA Funding Works**

CRA projects are funded through Tax Increment Financing (TIF):

- A base property value is established when the district is created.
- As property values rise, the additional tax revenue (the "increment") is set aside for redevelopment projects.
- The City and County retain taxes on the base value, while the CRA invests the increment back into the district.
- This funding model is designed to leverage private investment and create a cycle of growth and reinvestment.

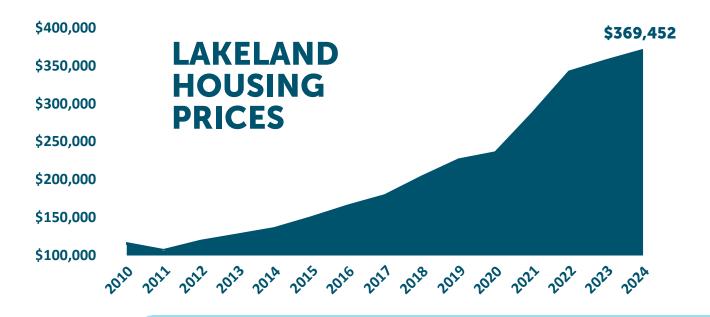

Lakeland ranked Best Place In Florida To Buy A House

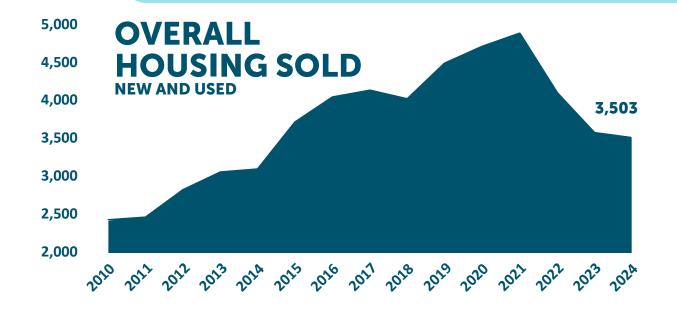
